NEW TOLL-FREE NUMBER ESTABLISHED FOR HURRICANES KATRINA AND RITA HOUSING

A new toll-free number is available for displaced victims of Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Rita. Established through the Kentucky Association for Community Action and coordinated through Kentucky Division of Emergency Management and the federal government, the new number is set up to provide information and assist families in receiving housing assistance.

The number - 1-800-456-3452 is available between 8:00 AM and 8:00 PM, Monday through Friday.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), along with the Kentucky office of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Rural Development, Kentucky Housing Corporation (KHC) and the Kentucky Association for Community Action are working together to provide housing assistance for Hurricane Katrina and Rita evacuees in Kentucky.

This housing assistance is available through either the Katrina Disaster Housing Assistance Program (KDHAP) or FEMA's public assistance program.

The KDHAP program is for Hurricane Katrina evacuees only and is administered through HUD and its partner agencies. The program provides rental assistance for Hurricane Katrina evacuees who resided in an affected area and were receiving federal rental assistance or who were homeless prior to Hurricane Katrina.

The FEMA public assistance program provides assistance with rents, deposits and utilities for families affected by both Hurricane Katrina and Hurricane Rita. This public assistance is available to all eligible evacuees, including those not eligible for assistance through the KDHAP Program, and is in addition to any individual assistance a family may be eligible to receive from FEMA.
